- Sustainable Development in Action

The focus and theme that carried through the event was networking and creating relationships across boundaries to

facilitate growth. Presentations from the event will be available on the UNWGIC website in coming months to keep the momentum going as well as to spread and share the knowledge.

It was an inspiring three days to see all the possibilities in the geospatial world. The setting of the event was unlike anything we have ever seen. The venue which hosted the event, was built specifically for the 1,200 participants. An estimated 5,000 volunteers were involved in ensuring that the event ran seamlessly from one session to the next plenary.
