

Gamers to gather at rAge 2016

Tens of thousands of gaming and technology enthusiasts are expected to descend on GrandWest's Sun Exhibits for rAge 2016, South Africa's biggest annual video gaming, computer, technology and 'geek culture' exhibition. The popular exhibition takes place over three days from 18 to 20 March 2016.
